LANTA Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 noon by Kim Schaffer, Chair of the Authority.

2. Public Comment

No comments were provided during Public Comment.

3. Approval of the Minutes

The minutes of the November 16, 2021 Board of Directors meeting were approved on a motion made by Ms. Miller and seconded by Mr. Malozi.

4. Report of the Chair

As part of the Report of the Chair, Ms. Schaffer wished the Board and staff a happy holiday season and noted it has been nice to be able to meet in person over the past few months. Ms. Schaffer thanked the LANTA drivers and staff for their continued service and commitment throughout the year. She noted that she looks forward to celebrating LANTA's 50th anniversary in the new year.

Ms. Schaffer then concluded the Report of the Chair.

5. Report of the Committees

A. <u>Finance & Administration Committee</u> – Mr. Williams reported that the Finance & Administration Committee met on Tuesday December 7. As part of the agenda, staff presented the financial statements for the LANtaBus, LANtaVan, and Carbon County Community Transit operating divisions for October 2021, subject to audit, which are attached. The meeting included a detailed presentation and discussion of the financial statements.

On a motion made by Mr. Williams and seconded by Ms. Linares, the Board voted to approve the LANtaBus, LANtaVan, and Carbon County Community Transit financial statements for October 2021, subject to audit.

Under procurements, staff presented a recommendation to extend the current contracts with LANTA's legal services providers for a period of one year beginning January 1, 2022. The current contractors include King Spry and Summers Nagy. The recommendation summary is attached.

On a motion made by Mr. Williams and seconded by Ms. Bradley, the Board voted to approve the one-year contract extensions for King Spry and Summers Nagy as presented.

Staff presented a recommendation to approve a Mutual Cooperation Agreement between LANTA and Carbon County for the continued administration by LANTA of the Carbon County Community Transit services. Staff discussed the elements of the agreement as well as the administrative benefits. This arrangement would not represent an organizational merger and the composition of LANTA and the LANTA Board would not change. In addition, Carbon County will still be required to provide the necessary local match to state and federal grants for service in Carbon County. The recommendation summary and agreement document are attached.

On a motion made by Mr. Williams and seconded by Ms. Alvarado, the Board voted to approve the proposed Mutual Cooperation Agreement between LANTA and Carbon County as presented.

Staff also presented an updated version of the roles and responsibilities authorization resolution which is required by PennDOT for the PennDOT grants management system. This update is necessary due to staff changes and re-assigned responsibilities among staff. The updated resolution is attached.

On a motion made by Mr. Williams and seconded by Mr. Lichtenberger, the Board voted to approve the updated resolution document as presented.

In addition, representatives from RKL, LLP, LANTA's auditing firm presented the draft audit documents for LANTA and Carbon County Community Transit. The auditors reported that they intend to issue audit reports with no findings for both LANTA and the Carbon system. RKL did note that one modification needs to be made to an entry regarding LANTA's line of credit. With that change, the audit reports will be finalized and issued to LANTA.

On a motion made by Mr. Williams and seconded by Ms. Alvarado, the Board voted to approve the draft financial audits with the one entry change described by the auditor.

Mr. Williams then concluded his report.

- B. <u>LANtaBus Rider Experience & Planning Committee</u> Mr. Malozi, Chair of the LANtaBus Rider Experience & Planning Committee, reported that the Committee did not meet in December and that the next meeting of the Committee is scheduled for Tuesday February 15.
- C. <u>Capital Asset Management Committee</u> Ms. Bradley, Chair of the Capital Asset Management Committee, reported that the Capital Asset Management Committee met on Tuesday December 7.

The agenda included a review of the Capital Asset Management Dashboard Report for the period of July through September 2021. The report is attached. The Dashboard shows that all maintenance and fleet reliability measures are better than benchmark with the exception of bus detailed interior cleanings which was below benchmark. Staff noted that the bus cleaning crew had not been fully staffed during the quarter, but staffing has since returned to normal.

Under procurements, staff presented a recommendation to issue a purchase order for the purchase of fifteen (15) paratransit vans for the purpose of LANtaVan fleet replacement. The purchase would be made through the multi-agency statewide van procurement and would be subject to the completion of the required buy America audits. The detailed recommendation summary is attached.

On a motion made by Ms. Bradley and seconded by Ms. Miller, the Board voted to approve a purchase order for fifteen (15) paratransit vans for LANtaVan fleet replacement be issued to Coach and Equipment Bus Sales, Inc. of Pen Yan, New York, subject to the completion of the Buy America audit, along with the ancillary services noted in the recommendation summary.

Also as part of the agenda, staff reported that the 12th Street Paratransit Facility being constructed by Serfass Construction for lease by LANTA continues to progress on schedule. Staff reported that LANTA has also ordered a vehicle wash, vehicle lifts, as well as office and other furniture for the facility. All items are expected to be delivered in a timely manner for the commencement of the lease and the start of operations by the selected operations contractor.

Staff also reported that the project to complete the replacement of concrete in the bus storage area of LANTA's Allentown garage was scheduled to be complete the week of the meeting. The project involved replacing all of the concrete in the storage lanes as well as painting the walls and columns to be more reflective and identifiable, as well as painting clearly marked pathways to walk through the facility. New lighting has also been installed in the project area. The project addresses several state-of-good-repair and workplace safety issues.

Lastly, staff presented the draft Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) submission for FFY 2023-2026 for LANTA and Carbon County Community Transit to be submitted in draft form to PennDOT as part of the MPO approval process. Staff noted that the dollar amounts in the project line items will change once guidance is received regarding funding levels which have changed with the passage of the federal infrastructure

legislation. Once the final document is developed, it will be presented again to the Board. The draft TIP submissions are attached.

On a motion made by Ms. Bradley and seconded by Mr. Lichtenberger, the Board voted to approve the draft TIP submission for LANTA as presented.

On a motion made by Ms. Bradley and seconded by Ms. Alvarado, the Board voted to approve the draft TIP submission for Carbon County Community Transit as presented.

Ms. Bradley then concluded her report.

D. <u>LANtaVan & Accessibility Committee</u> – Ms. Miller, Chair of the LANtaVan & Accessibility Committee, reported that the LANtaVan & Accessibility Committee met that day prior to the Board meeting.

The agenda included an opportunity for public comment as well as an update on comments received at the September meeting of the Committee. The summary of the follow up is attached.

The agenda also included a review of the LANtaVan Dashboard report for the first quarter of fiscal year 2022. The report is attached. The report shows that ridership was up in the first quarter of fiscal year 2022 compared to the same quarter in fiscal year 2021 by approximately 11 percent. Staff did note that ridership is still below normal pre-COVID levels. Other key items for the first quarter of the fiscal year, which covered July 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021 include the fact that average length of trips in terms of miles and hours are within target levels; 93% of trips were completed in under 90 minutes; and 90% of ADA trips were completed within 15 minutes of the fixed route equivalent.

For the quarter, the percentage of trips that were in the on-time window or earlier was 79 percent. However, staff did note that on-time performance for the current quarter has worsened due to an increase in trip volumes combined with a significant driver shortage.

The dashboard also provided data regarding the number and nature of complaints processed regarding LANtaVan service as well as ADA related complaints on the LANtaBus system.

Lastly, representatives from Easton Coach Company provided an update on their efforts to hire paratransit drivers to ensure adequate staffing.

Ms. Miller then concluded her report.

6. Other Items

A. Under Other Items, Mr. O'Neil noted that LANTA had received confirmation from the Pennsylvania Department of State that the charter amendment extending LANTA's charter for a period of 50 years had been received and recorded. This represented the final step in the process. Mr. O'Neil thanked Mr. Herman and the staff at King Spry for their diligence in completing the process.

Attached for your review are the unaudited financial statements for the period ended October 31, 2021, for LANtaBus, LANtaVan and Carbon Transit.

Items of Interest:

- The LANTA's Line of Credit Balance as of December 6th stands at \$0 of an available \$6,000,000. The balance in the combined LANTA general checking account stands at \$5K. State ACT 89 funds due to LANTA for FY 21/22 are current. The balance in the ACT 44 checking account stands at \$10,374,562. The account is currently underfunded by approximately \$8.4M. In addition, approximately \$8.9M are either currently owed to LANTA from State Funds or can now be drawn down from Federal Grants:
 - State Shared Ride/PWD \$173,050 (THRU 11/30/2021)
 - Lehigh County MATP \$713,914 (THRU 11/30/2021)
 - o Northampton County MATP \$380,673 (THRU 11/30/2021)
 - Local Operating Assistance \$1,163,784 (Fy22 Local Match)
 - o Federal Capital Funding \$5,641,760 (THRU 10/31/21)
 - State Capital Funding \$920,100 (THRU 10/31/21)
- The balance in the CT general checking account stands at approximately \$44K. The balance in the CT's Act 44 checking account stands at \$1K. The account is currently underfunded by approximately \$135K. The line of credit balance stands at \$96,458. State ACT 89 funds due to CT for FY 21/22 are approximately \$22K. In addition, approximately \$259K are currently owed to CT from the following sources:
 - o State Shared Ride/PWD \$26,976 (THRU 11/30/2021)
 - o Carbon County MATP \$190,849 (THRU 11/30/2021)
 - Local Operating Assistance \$41,945 (Fy22 Local Match)
- Fulton Financial ACT 72 Letter for period ended 10/31/2021 was received and all bank accounts are in compliance.
- 2020/2021 NTD data is currently being reviewed and questions are being answered as received.

Year-to-date revenues for the fixed route division totals \$562,625. This represents a 20.11 percent decrease from the current year budget projection of \$704,225. Fare collection revenue is currently running below budget projections by approximately \$90K, resulting in an 18.43 percent negative budget variance. The Other Revenue section, which includes Advertising Revenue is in line with current year budget projections as the budget was based on the guaranteed monthly amount. The Authority anticipates recognizing additional advertising revenue in January 2022, once the calendar year reconciliation is complete.

Year-to-date expenses for the fixed route division totals \$10,185,778. This represents a 1.87 percent decrease from the current year budget projection of \$10,379,558. For the current fiscal year period, Labor, Fringes Purchased Transportation, and Casualty and Liability Insurance continue as the top expense variables contributing to the budget variances. These categories, as well as all variables, will be continually monitored with further investigation occurring as required. Labor is the first expense variable area to be mentioned in detail and is continuing to run above budget. With the hiring of additional staff and the payment of overtime to ensure service needs are met due to absences amongst the driver pool, the 12.57 percent above budget variance is not unusual. The Fringe Benefits area is the second area of variance to be detailed. Health insurance is self-funded and LANTA budgets based on actuarial analysis for a worst-case scenario from our outside health insurance broker. YTD, the actual usage is below the anticipated scenario by approximately \$398K. The Authority expects this trend to continue through the remainder of the fiscal year. Purchased Transportation continues to operate above budget projections by approximately \$64k, a 9.40 percent increase above budget projections. This is due to the monthly recognition of the Carbon Transit Federal Subsidy Pass-through.

Lastly, the area of Casualty and Liability is the last area to be reviewed. Current year expense for both Physical Damage and Liability and Property Damage insurance is currently under budget by \$209K, which represents a 113.60 percent budget variance.

Year-to-date deficit recorded on the fixed route division totals \$9,623,153. This represents a 0.54 percent decrease from the current budget projection. Current total subsidies equal the deficit and include the following sources:

Federal Subsidy - ARPA - \$3,587,763 Federal Subsidy - All Other - \$1,708,795 State Subsidy - \$3,953,430 Local Subsidy - \$373,165

LANtaVan

Year-to-date revenues for LANtaVan totals \$2,476,421. This represents a 29.93 percent decrease from the current year budget projection of \$3,533,985. LANtaVan records and adjusts MATP revenue to reflect the cost of the program to maintain a conservative approach to revenue recognition. Currently, MATP revenue is approximately \$142K below budget projections. ADA and Lottery trips are showing significant increases in ridership. ADA is showing a 43.0 percent increase, while Lottery is showing a 34.0 percent increase over the prior period.

Year-to-date expenses for LANtaVan totals \$2,714,733. This represents a 21.47 percent decrease from the current year budget projection of \$3,456,962. Majority of the deviation resides in the Purchased Transportation area. The variance within the Purchased Transportation area continues to relate to decreased trips thus less expense billed from Easton Coach as well as the proper allocation of fueling expense of vehicles used for Carbon Transit. MATP pass through contracted service providers invoices, and in turn expense, are current for the period. Please remember, no revenues are booked for pass through trips until expense/cost is recorded thus no mismatch of revenue and expense. The net result is approximately a \$652K below budget variance for this area. The remaining expense variances are smaller in amount and will continue to be monitored and investigated as warranted.

Year-to-date deficit recorded on LANtaVan totals \$238,312.

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Carbon Transit

Year-to-date revenues for Carbon Transit totals \$309,496. This represents a 23.86 percent increase from the current budget projection of \$249,885. Carbon Transit records and adjusts MATP revenue to reflect the cost of the program to maintain a conservative approach to revenue recognition. Currently, MATP revenue is approximately \$48K above budget. ADA and PWD trips are showing significant increases in ridership. ADA is showing a 39.0 percent increase, while PWD is showing an 85.0 percent increase over the prior period.

Year-to-date expenses for Carbon Transit totals \$510,355. This amount is 14.55 percent above the budget projection of \$455,543. The main deviation of approximately \$50K pertains to the Purchased Transportation area and relates to the proper recognition of fueling expense for the Carbon Transit fleet. Materials and Supplies is experiencing a 155.74 negative percent budget variance. This is a result of the purchase of additional ticket inventory. The amount of stock purchased is expected to sustain the inventory through the end of the fiscal year.

Year-to-date deficit recorded on Carbon Transit totals \$200,858. Current total subsidies include the following sources:

Federal Subsidy - \$93,412 State Subsidy - \$93,790 Local Subsidy - \$13,656







RECOMMENDATION OF APPROVAL ONE-YEAR EXTENSION OF LEGAL SERVICES CONTRACTS

MUTUAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

THIS MUTUAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT made this day of	, 2021,
by and between the COUNTY OF CARBON, a Sixth Class County organized t	under the laws of
the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with its principal offices located in the Cou	urt House Annex,
Jim Thorpe, Pennsylvania, (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY"), and the LE	HIGH AND
NORTHAMPTON TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, a municipal authority	y organized under
the Municipal Authorities Act of 1945, with its principal offices located at 1060) Lehigh Street,
Allentown, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, (hereinafter referred to as "LANTA");
:	

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has entered into grant agreements with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation, providing for public transportation grants and assistance to the COUNTY; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such grant agreements, the Carbon County Board of Commissioners have committed to the establishment and maintenance of a public transportation system consisting of an integrated para-transit service and fixed-route service; and

WHEREAS, LANTA is a municipal authority engaged in the activity of providing public transportation services within the Counties of Lehigh and Northampton, including publicly advertised transportation by vehicles operating in accordance with published schedules on fixed routes, and in a door-to-door fashion in support of or as an extension of these fixed routes, financed by established fares charged to passengers and subsidized by federal, state and local public funds; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has determined that LANTA, as a municipal authority, possesses the specialized, professional skills necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of the COUNTY; and

WHEREAS, the Counties of Lehigh and Northampton have authorized LANTA to contract with the COUNTY to provide an effective and efficient public transportation system; and

WHEREAS, LANTA has the expertise to operate and manage the COUNTY'S public transportation system and to continue and expand the COUNTY'S public transportation system in an integrated and efficient manner so as to provide public transportation to the extent needed and feasible for the benefit of the COUNTY and the entire Lehigh valley region.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's transportation funding legislation, Act 89 of 2013, encourages the creation of mutual cooperation agreements between local governments and public transportation providers to create efficiencies and utilize existing expertise.

NOW THEREFORE, intending to be legally bound, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. COUNTY Commitments

- (a) COUNTY agrees to pay the local share required under the terms of any federal and state grants to which the COUNTY is a party relating to the operation of the public transportation system in the COUNTY, provided the said grant application has been approved by the COUNTY.
- (b) COUNTY agrees to join in all applications prepared by LANTA for all federal and state grants for the operation of the public transportation system in the COUNTY when required, so long as permitted by all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations.
- (c) COUNTY shall cause all obligations arising out of the operation of the public transportation system to be paid in full in accordance with the budget approved in the manner set forth in Paragraph 10 of this Agreement for the operation of the public transportation system or the budget as amended for the operation of the public transportation system.
- (d) COUNTY agrees that LANTA shall have no responsibilities of any kind to make payment of any existing debt or other obligations with respect to the operation of the public transportation system in the COUNTY, which may have been, accrued prior to the initiation of LANTA operations.

2. LANTA Commitments.

- (a) LANTA agrees to operate, manage and, to the extent needed and feasible, when approved by the County Commissioners, expand the public transportation services throughout Carbon County, Pennsylvania. It is agreed that all service changes shall be recommended by LANTA and approved by COUNTY only after notice of the recommended changes have been advertised in a newspaper of general circulation in Carbon County or approved at a public hearing in accordance with federal, state and local rules, laws and regulations.
- (b) As the designated service provider for the COUNTY under this Agreement, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, LANTA will use its best efforts in good faith to manage the public transportation services in a manner that will continue and, to the extent needed and feasible, when approved by the County Commissioners, expand public transportation throughout Carbon County, Pennsylvania.
- (c) LANTA will use its best efforts in good faith to operate public transportation services in an integrated fashion so as to most efficiently serve those persons needing such services throughout Carbon County, Pennsylvania.

3. LANTA Services.

LANTA, in keeping with the policies and procedures established by the LANTA shall furnish to the COUNTY services required for the operation of a public transportation system in the COUNTY in a satisfactory and proper manner, subject to approval by the COUNTY Commissioners, as follows:

- (a) Design a coordinated paratransit transportation system. Oversee the operation and daily administration of shared-ride paratransit transportation service, monitoring and preparation of related grant applications and documentation.
- (b) Design an inter-community fixed-route transit service, daily administration of the fixed-route system and preparation of the operating assistance grant applications and related documentation.
- (c) LANTA will be authorized to determine service levels to support the continuance of service and to meet the needs within the communities in the County. All major service changes will be planned and communicated in conjunction with the County.
- (d) Prepare Capital Procurement grant applications. Administer that program in compliance with all Federal, State and Local requirements, and further subject to COUNTY approval. LANTA shall utilize its self-certification procurement process on behalf of the COUNTY.
- (e) Provide all management and operational services, including but not limited to vehicle operation, schedule preparation, maintenance, labor relations, accounting, data collection, employee selection, training and discipline, marketing, public relations, risk management, insurance procurement and maintenance, claims adjusting, process and procurement of goods and services, and any other management services necessary for the operation of a public transportation system.
- (f) Oversee all of the administrative components of the COUNTY's public transportation system, including: staffing, application, preparation, budgeting, accounting, bidding preparation, project design and construction, report preparation, program modifications and grant closeouts, subject to COUNTY review and approval.
- (g) Prepare grant applications and project modifications.
- (h) Schedule and attend public hearings required for applications and program modifications with the COUNTY.
- (i) Attend such meetings concerning the Transportation Improvement Program as are required.
- (i) Administer the program in compliance with Federal, State and Local requirements.
- (k) Adhere to the Single Audit Act of 1984 as amended, 0MB Circular A-133 Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations, and other specific Federal and State circulars, policies and regulations.
- (l) Maintain specific records for the purpose of audit and/or reimbursement and supply on request any and all information and documentation which is requested by the COUNTY relative to the public transportation system.
- (m) Coordinate all aspects of the program with COUNTY liaison representative(s).

- (n) Adherence to Transportation Act. LANTA agrees in the performance of its obligations hereunder to abide by the terms and conditions of any federal and/or state grant agreement entered into by the COUNTY.
- (o) Be the sole employer of any employee working for LANTA and performing services under the purview of this Agreement as set forth in Paragraph 9 herein.

4. Revenues.

- (a) LANTA shall be the direct recipient of Federal Transit Administration and Pennsylvania Department of Transportation public transportation grants as related to the delivery and maintenance of transit service in the County based upon the COUNTY's fulfillment of local match obligations.
- (b) The County reserves the right to offset fares with non-transportation grant funds.
- (c) Both parties recognize that LANTA can charge the various grant programs costs incurred for premium services which are defined as those services for transportation outside of the normal fixed route and paratransit shared ride services, and the out-of-pocket costs for maintenance to vehicles provided by LANTA for the operation of public transportation service for the County.

5. Term.

The operating portion of this agreement shall begin on January 1, 2022 and shall remain in effect unless and until one or both parties initiate the termination of the agreement as set forth in Section 18 of this Agreement.

6. Ownership of Property.

All vehicles currently owned by the COUNTY utilized to perform the COUNTY's public transportation services prior to the effective date of this agreement shall become the sole property of LANTA. All vehicles purchased and/or possessed by LANTA on the COUNTY'S behalf to perform the COUNTY'S public transportation services prior to the effective date of this Agreement shall become the sole property of LANTA. All vehicles hereinafter acquired by LANTA to perform the COUNTY's public transportation services shall be the sole property of LANTA. All personal property purchased on the COUNTY's behalf by LANTA to perform the COUNTY's public transportation services prior to the effective date of this agreement shall become the sole property of LANTA. All personal property hereinafter acquired by LANTA to perform the COUNTY's public transportation services shall be the sole property of LANTA. On the day of LANTA's assumption of responsibility for operating the public transportation system, an inventory of all COUNTY capital assets shall be conducted so that there is a clear written record of the specific property owned by the COUNTY and the condition of said property.

7. Property and Facilities to be Provided.

- (a) COUNTY shall furnish to LANTA for the operation of public transportation services such personal property of the COUNTY now or hereafter owned by or leased to the COUNTY and used in conjunction with its public transportation system, including but not limited to passenger vehicles and related vehicles and equipment.
- (b) In performance of its management and administrative duties under this Agreement, LANTA shall be responsible for arranging at the COUNTY'S expense for all facilities and office space, equipment, facilities, and other real or personal property provided or supplied by the COUNTY or purchased on the COUNTY'S behalf for the operation of public transportation services. Any such expenses shall be within the budget prepared by LANTA and approved by the Carbon County Commissioners for the operation of the COUNTY's public transportation system.

8. Employees.

All persons employed in providing management and administrative functions, and other employees (e.g. dispatchers, schedulers, operators, mechanics, etc.) required to operate the public transportation system shall be employees of LANTA. LANTA shall have the right to competitively bid for the services of dispatchers, schedulers, drivers, mechanics and other employees required to operate the public transportation system, and award this work, if appropriate, to an independent contractor or contractors. The cost of all employees other than LANTA'S management and administrative employees shall be an operational cost either reimbursed under grant agreements, through fares, or paid by the COUNTY provided such operational cost is within the budget prepared by LANTA and approved by the Carbon County Commissioners.

9. Budgets. Operating Plans and Records.

- (a) Prior to the beginning of each year of this Agreement, LANTA shall present to the COUNTY for its review and approval a proposed budget for public transportation services during such fiscal year setting forth in such detail as the COUNTY shall require all items of income and revenue including the sources thereof and all items of expense. LANTA will meet with the COUNTY'S board from time to time following the presentation of such budget to explain, review and if necessary, revise it in keeping with the COUNTY'S direction. Prior to the beginning of such fiscal year, the COUNTY will adopt and approve a budget for the COUNTY's public transportation system. Anything to the contrary notwithstanding contained in this Agreement, the COUNTY shall not be responsible for the payment of any costs or expenses not included within the budget for the COUNTY's public transportation system, approved by the Carbon County Commissioners, including any revisions of the budget approved by the County Commissioners. In the event required by the COUNTY, LANTA will provide calendar year budget estimates prior to November first of each calendar year.
- (b) LANTA shall permit the authorized representatives of the COUNTY to inspect and audit all data and records of LANTA relating to its performance under this Agreement. To the extent that state or federal funds are involved, the right to inspect and audit shall extend to authorized representatives of the United States, and appropriate officials of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

- (c) Both parties recognize that service provisions must be within the requirements of Federal, State and local laws, ordinances and regulations.
- **10. Purchasing.** LANTA will notify the COUNTY from time to time concerning the types and amounts of materials, services, supplies and equipment, including buses and other transit equipment, needed in the operation of the COUNTY'S public transportation system.
- 11. Financial Records. LANTA will keep and maintain books and records reflecting the operation of the COUNTY'S public transportation services in conformity with the requirements of the COUNTY and the various funding sources and will render and certify to the COUNTY and federal or state agencies such full and complete monthly operating reports and financial statements as the COUNTY or federal and state agencies may require. LANTA will prepare all reports, financial projects and recommendations required by the COUNTY or by federal or state agencies. The responsibility for the maintenance of all records of the COUNTY public transportation system prior to the initiation of LANTA operations shall be that of the COUNTY.

12. Insurance.

- (a) LANTA shall maintain the following levels of insurance during the term of this agreement:
 - i. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance as required by Pennsylvania law.
 - ii. Commercial General Liability Insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury including death and property damage, \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. The provisions of the Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act shall be applicable where appropriate to LANTA's obligations under this paragraph.
 - iii. Automobile Liability Insurance in the minimum amount of \$500,000 per person, \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage insurance in the minimum amount of \$500,000 per accident.

LANTA shall provide written proof of the above insurance to the satisfaction of the COUNTY. The COUNTY shall be named as additional insured on LANTA's general insurance policies and such coverage shall be primary and non-contributory.

- (b) The cost of all insurances relating to the operation of the COUNTY's public transportation system, such as worker's compensation insurance for dispatchers, schedulers, operators and mechanics; vehicle insurance; and general liability insurance shall be a cost of operation of the public transportation system and paid from the funding sources set forth in Paragraph 1.
- (c) LANTA will notify the COUNTY of any cancellation, termination or expiration of its insurance.
- (d) LANTA may self-insure any of the above noted insurance coverages so long as

LANTA can provide evidence to the COUNTY of a properly funded, administered self-insurance program which must be approved by the Board of Commissioners of the COUNTY, said approval not to be unreasonably withheld.

13. Relationship of the Parties.

LANTA is an independent party. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, it shall have the right to hire, supervise and discharge its employees and determine their compensation. LANTA shall be solely responsible for compensating its employees, including compliance with Social Security requirements, withholding and other related matters.

14. Personal Liability.

No officer, director or employee of LANTA or COUNTY shall be personally liable for the performance of the terms of this Agreement.

15. Conflicts of Interests.

- (a) LANTA covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, in the properties or matters reviewed under this Agreement or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its duties hereunder. LANTA further covenants that in the performance of this Agreement, it will not employ any person having any such interest.
- (b) No member of the governing body of the COUNTY or LANTA and no other officer, employee, or agent of the COUNTY or LANTA who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the carrying out of the Agreement shall have any personal interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement.
- (c) No member of the governing body of the locality in which the COUNTY is situated and no other public official of such locality who exercises any functions or responsibilities in the review or approval of or the carrying out of this Agreement shall have any personal interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement.
- (d) No member of or Delegate to the Congress of the United States shall be admitted to any share of part of this Agreement or to any benefit to arise here from.

16. Anti-Discrimination Policy.

(a) In connection with the carrying out of this Agreement, LANTA shall not discriminate against any employees or applicants for employment because of race, creed, color, sex, age, handicap, or national origin. LANTA will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, creed, color, sex, age, handicap or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or

termination, rate of pay, other forms of compensation; and selection of training including apprenticeship. The applicable provisions of the Presidential Executive Order 11375 relating to Equal Employment Opportunity is incorporated by reference herein, so long as said Order remains in effect.

- (b) LANTA will cooperate with the COUNTY in meeting commitments and goals with regard to the maximum utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises and will use its best efforts to insure that disadvantaged business enterprises shall have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for subcontract work under any contract
- (c) COUNTY agrees that, in the event LANTA is charged with or sued for any alleged discriminatory practices, if such alleged practices are judicially determined to have occurred at the sole direction of the COUNTY or were done according to the express policies of the COUNTY, or were done according to the express written policies of the COUNTY will indemnify LANTA against any liability or expenses involved in the defense of such claims or lawsuits.

17. Indemnification.

- (a) LANTA agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the COUNTY against any and all claims, losses, damages or liabilities, joint and several, to which the COUNTY may become subject, insofar as such losses, claims, damages or liabilities, (or actions in respect thereof) arise out of LANTA's management and administrative services under this Agreement or LANTA's operation of the COUNTY's public transportation system or are based upon any other alleged act or omission in connection with LANTA's administration, management and operation of the COUNTY's public transportation system unless the losses, damages or liabilities arise from LANTA following express written directions or policies of the COUNTY. In particular, LANTA releases the COUNTY from, agrees that the COUNTY shall not be liable, and indemnifies the COUNTY against all liabilities, claims, costs and expenses imposed upon, incurred or asserted against the COUNTY on account of:
 - (i) Any loss or damage to property or injury to or death of or loss by any person that may be occasioned by any cause whatsoever pertaining to the maintenance and use of vehicles or the operation of the COUNTY public transportation system;
 - (ii) A breach or default on the part of LANTA in the performance of any covenant or agreement of LANTA under this Agreement, or any related document, or arising from any act or failure to act by LANTA, or any of its agents, contractors, servants, employees or licensees;
 - (iii) The performance of any covenant of LANTA;
 - (iv) Any alleged discriminatory practices, unless such alleged practices are judicially determined to have occurred at the sole direction of the COUNTY or were done according to express written policies of the COUNTY.

- (b) In case any action or proceedings brought against the COUNTY, in respect of which indemnity may be sought hereunder, the COUNTY shall promptly give notice of that action or proceeding to LANTA, and LANTA upon receipt of that notice shall have the obligation and the right to assume the defense of the action or proceeding; provided, that failure by the COUNTY to give notice shall not relieve LANTA from any of its obligations under this Section unless that failure prejudices the defense of the action or proceeding by LANTA. At its own expense, the COUNTY may employ separate counsel and participate in the defense. LANTA shall not be liable for any settlement made without its consent.
- (c) Any provision herein or elsewhere to the contrary notwithstanding, this section of the Agreement shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- (d) To the extent of the COUNTY's applicable insurance coverage, the COUNTY agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the COUNTY against any and all claims, losses, damages or liabilities, joint and several, to which the COUNTY may become subject, insofar as such losses, damages or liabilities arise from LANTA following express written directions or policies of the COUNTY.

18. Default; Termination.

- (a) In the event either party should breach this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall give the breaching party written notice of such breach setting forth the facts of the breach in reasonable detail. In the event the breaching party fails to cure the breach within thirty (30) days from receipt of such notice, the non-breaching party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving written notice of such termination to the breaching party.
- (b) This Agreement may be terminated at the option of either party if the other party is adjudicated bankrupt, is subjected to the appointment of a receiver and fails to have such receiver removed within sixty (60) days, or has any of its property attached and fails to remove such attachment within sixty (60) days.
- (c) This Agreement may also be terminated at the option of either party for any reason with one party providing the other with notification one-hundred and eighty (180) days prior to the desired termination date.
- (d) Under any circumstances under which this Agreement is terminated, the following will take place:
 - (i) All assets, vehicles, buses, equipment, whether or not identified in Exhibit A to this agreement which were owned by County or LANTA and used by LANTA in providing any services noted in this agreement shall be transferred back to County or to such other entity as County shall designate as noted above, free of any claim of or lien by LANTA or any third party, person or entity. To the extent any such assets, vehicles, buses and equipment have been retired or replaced and reinvestments due to such retired or replace items have made by LANTA into the County's transportation program or any portion of a program servicing the County, such assets, vehicles, buses and equipment will be also transferred to

- County or to such other entity as County shall designate free of any claim or lien by LANTA or any third party, person or entity.
- (ii) LANTA agrees to pay to the County any funds from collected revenues, local share payments, state or federal grants collected by LANTA in providing any services noted in this agreement that have not been encumbered as of the date of termination of this agreement.
- (iii) County shall be the direct recipient of Pennsylvania Department of Transportation public transportation grants as related to the delivery and maintenance of transit service in the County.

Upon the transfer of all assets to the County or its designee as required by Paragraph 18(d)(i) above, this agreement shall be considered terminated except to the extent necessary to ensure continued payment of any local share as noted in Paragraph 18(d)(ii), above.

19. Force Majeure.

In the event LANTA or the COUNTY is unable to perform an obligation it has a duty to perform under this Agreement by reason of an Act of God or riot, insurrection, fire, explosion, injunction, inability to obtain fuel, governmental action, order or decree of any court, casualty or other cause wholly beyond the control of the non-performing party, the non-performing party shall be excused during the period in which its performance has been prevented by one or more of the foregoing causes from performance, but shall recommence and continue to perform promptly after the removal or cessation of such cause.

20. Invalidity of Provision.

Should any part of this Agreement be declared to be unconstitutional, invalid or beyond the authority of either party to enter into or carry out, such declaration will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement, which will continue to be in full force and effect except that if any part is declared unconstitutional or invalid beyond the authority of a party to enter into or carry out is, in the judgment of the COUNTY or LANTA, material to the Agreement, the COUNTY shall have the right on thirty (30) days written notice to the other to terminate this Agreement.

21. Notices.

All notices required or allowed by this Agreement shall be in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the receiving party as follows:

22. Governing Law.

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Venue for any disputes involving this agreement shall be in the Court of Common Pleas of Carbon County Pennsylvania. The parties waive their right to trial by jury.

FY- 2022-2023 LANta Van Acquisition Summary

To acquire new replacement vehicles for the LANtaVan system, this year LANTA again participated in a statewide, multi-agency RFP process for paratransit vehicles. This most recent procurement was led by South Central Transit Authority of Lancaster, PA, with assistance of developing, reviewing and recommending award by the review committee consisting of several representatives from throughout the state, including LANTA. This process is designed to provide a safe, reliable, and competitively priced units for all agencies to purchase from the joint contract without the burden of developing their own specs and going thru the bidding process. LANTA has purchased our paratransit vehicles in this fashion for over 13 years.

LANTA intends to purchase fifteen (15) model year 2023 Ford E-450 vehicles with a Phoenix chassis 14,500 pound GVW. These vehicles will replace the fifteen (15) 2016 Chevrolet Diesel engine vans, which will leave nine (9) Diesel engine vans in the fleet. It should be noted that this year's vehicles will be acquired thru Coach and Equipment Bus Sales, Inc. of Penn Yan, New York. LANTA has purchased vans from Coach and Equipment Bus Sales previously, including the fifteen (15) vans recently received in November 2021.

These vehicles that we intend to acquire have V-8 gas engines, automatic transmissions, Braun wheelchair lifts with a 1,000 pound capacity, full wheelchair securement systems, fire suppression system and are quite similar to the current fleet, This larger modified chassis will provide LANtaVan a more diverse seating layout plan which will allow the vehicles to accommodate up to six wheelchair positions per van if needed. Delivery of these vehicles is tentatively scheduled for October 2022.

The effective date of the contract is April 1, 2020, expiring March 31, 2022, with three (3) 1 year options available to extend the contract.


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


